Dr. Karen Alter-Reid , PhD, is a clinical psychologist and founder of the Big Oak Psychotherapy Training Institute. She is a Regional EMDR Institute Trainer, a TR HAP Trainer, and EMDRIA Specialty Presenter. She is also the Senior EMDR Consultant and Trainer for the National Institute for the Psychotherapies in New York City.



Eboni Bugg, LCSW, is an EMDRIA Certified practitioner and Consultant-in-Training in private practice. Her work focuses on healing culturally-based trauma as a form of social justice and nurturing developing clinicians. Eboni integrates evidence-based modalities including EMDR, Motivational Interviewing, Internal Family Systems, Mindfulness, and Yoga to foster holistic change and wellness. Eboni is a founding member of the Central Virginia Clinicians of Color Network and coordinated the first EMDR Basic Training for People of Color (trainer- Mark Nickerson, LICSW) in Charlottesville, VA.



Rolf Carriere, MA, studied development economics and philosophy at Groningen University, Netherlands. From 1971 till 2005 he worked with UNICEF and the World Bank, mostly in health and nutrition in Asia, including 9 years in India. His last positions were UNICEF Country Representative in Bhutan, Myanmar, Bangladesh and Indonesia. In 1985, he co-founded the Iodine Global Network (ICCIDD). In 2002, he established and managed the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) in Geneva. In 2016, he founded the Global Initiative for Stress and Trauma Treatment (GIST-T). He currently serves on the Boards of Nonviolent Peaceforce and the Free Yezidi Foundation.



Quandra Chaffers, LCSW, is the creative force behind Sexual Abuse & Sex Solutions, a private practice located in San Francisco. She helps teenagers and adults to overcome intimate partner violence and sexual abuse. Quandra is a queer, kink, & poly knowledgeable sex therapist specializing in areas of sexless marriages, painful sex, and problematic sexual behaviors. She taught as an Adjunct Professor at Washington University in St. Louis. For four years, Quandra treated an average of 90 survivors per year as a Case Manager-Therapist at the YWCA St Louis Regional Sexual Assault Center. As a volunteer of Rape and Violence Ends Now (RAVEN), she co-facilitated batter's intervention programming for 6 years, working to rehabilitate men who have been abusive.



Cheryl A. Clayton, LCSW, is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and a Virginia Certified Sex Offender Treatment Provider. She is a Board Member of the Virginia Sex Offender Treatment Association. She served as the Director of Specialized Treatment Services of Virginia for Resources for Human Development, Inc. and is currently the Director of the Radford Counseling Group of Abingdon. Her clinical expertise is in the areas of assessing and treating youth and adults who have committed sexual offences. She has specialized in the treatment of sexual offenders and their families since 1994. Her area of specialization is in research and trauma informed treatment of sex offenders, including her work with EMDR therapy about which she has published and presented nationally.



Donald F. deGraffenried, LCSW is a passionate advocate for expanding EMDR therapy into agency and community mental health settings, with special interest in using EMDR therapy with the survivors of homicide. He is the Coordinator of the Greater New Haven Trauma Recovery Network (GNH TRN), sponsored by Trauma Recovery EMDR Humanitarian Assistance Programs (TREMDRHAP). GNH TRN provides pro bono EMDR therapy sessions to crime victims and survivors of homicide, who have been referred by the New Haven Police Department. deGraffenried is a Senior EMDR Trainer and consultant for TR EMDR HAP and nationally and internationally.

He is past President of the EMDR UK & Ireland Board, President of Trauma Aid Europe, Past Vice President of EMDR Europe Board, Chair of the EMDR Europe Practice Committee and a participating member of the Council of Scholars Future of EMDR Project. He is involved in Humanitarian Trauma Capacity Building programs in Pakistan, Turkey, India, Cambodia, Myanmar, Thailand, Indonesia, Lebanon, Poland, Philippines, Palestine and Iraq. His PhD in Psychology was researching survivor's experiences of sexual abuse perpetrated by clergy and he has written several related publications. Derek was the recipient of the 'David Servan Schreiber Award' (2013) for Outstanding Contribution to EMDR Therapy, shortlisted for the prestigious Times Higher Education Supplement (TES) Awards (2017) for 'International Impact' for his Humanitarian Trauma Capacity Building work in Iraq with the Free Yezidi Foundation and Jiyan Foundation for Torture and Human Rights, and awarded the Trauma Aid Europe 'Humanitarian of the Year Award' (2018).



Ana M Gómez, MC, LPC is the founder and director of the AGATE Institute in the U.S. She is an EMDR Institute, and EMDR-IBA trainer of trainers in Colombia and is a participating member of the Council of Scholars Future of EMDR Project. She is a psychotherapist, author, and an international speaker on the use of EMDR therapy with children and adolescents with complex and developmental trauma as well as generational wounds and dissociation. She has been the keynote and invited speaker at numerous conferences and workshops and has presented in over 70 cities in 15 countries.

Ana is the author of *EMDR Therapy and Adjunct Approaches with Children: Complex Trauma, Attachment and Dissociation* and several books, book chapters and articles on the use of EMDR therapy with children and adolescents. E. C. Hurley, DMin, PhD, is the Founder and CEO of Soldier Center, a community-based treatment center and EMDR training center specializing in the military, veterans, first-responder populations. A retired Army Colonel with 33 years military service, he specializes in treating persons with complex PTSD and moral injury. He presents EMDR basic and advanced trainings with a focus on these populations and is a participating member of the Council of Scholars Future of EMDR Project. Marlene Kenney, MA, LICSW is a Senior Clinician and Coordinator of the Trauma and Loss Counseling Program at Riverside Trauma Center, based in Needham, MA. She provides trauma response services including community consultation, crisis management, and trauma trainings (suicide prevention, toxic stress, suicide postvention, introduction to EMDR and EMDR Early Intervention Strategies). As a trauma responder Marlene has held community meetings and guided schools and their host communities through suicide clusters. She utilizes a range of expertise to provide integrative, sustainable trauma services when Riverside Trauma Center's help is requested. Marlene has responded to over 200 trauma responses ranging from the Boston Marathon Bombing, suicide deaths, homicides, sexual harassment allegations and natural disasters domestically and in the Philippines. She is a EMDRIA Approved Consultant and consults to agencies and clinicians in community mental health settings and others throughout New England and nationally.



Paul W. Miller, MD, DMH, MRCPsych, is a psychiatrist; accredited EMDR Trainer-in-training within EMDR Europe and an EMDR institute facilitator and is a participating member of the Council of Scholars Future of EMDR Project. He has developed award winning innovative programs designed to reduce and resolve interpersonal conflict and is the originator of the Cycle Model as an approach to assessing and treating problem behaviors.
